FTTH Coming to Rural Sebeka

The West Central Telephone Board of Directors approved completing the rural Sebeka fiber to the home (FTTH) project in one year, rather than phasing it out over several years. Engineering has staked 524 homes and businesses that will be converted from fiber to the node to 100% fiber to the home.

Beginning in March, we will begin setting appointments for our technicians to prewire the homes included in the project. The pre-wire consists of hanging the shells for both outside equipment and inside equipment, and feeding the pigtailed fiber into your home. The pre-wiring will make it much easier and quicker for the contractors to connect the new underground fiber optics to your home in late spring. Construction is slated for early May, depending on the weather and ground conditions, and availability of fiber optic cabling. We will be plowing in the back of the road right-of-way as our permits dictate, so keep that in mind when planting crops so they aren't damaged during construction.

Once this "last mile" of fiber optics from the node (equipment out in the field that houses digital electronics) to your house is installed, the entire West Central Telephone area will all have the same broadband services available including TV services, HDTV and DVR services, and faster Internet with up to 100 Mbps up and 100 Mbps down. Those in the rural Sebeka exchange can expect to be cutover to the FTTH network in early fall. At that time, TV services will be installed on a first-come, first-served basis. Given that, you may want to call us now and express your interest in the TV services in order to be placed on an installation waiting list.

Being connected to a 100% fiber optic infrastructure brings all things broadband and beyond to your home. Having a fiber-connected community and home means you can live, work, and play in beautiful rural Minnesota without sacrificing big city technology! As a matter of fact, compared to some metro areas, West Central Telephone cooperative members are ahead of the broadband race. All of our services — telephone, Internet and digital TV — are delivered over your new fiber optic broadband connection!

Scholarship Opportunities

As an investment in our youth, we're committed to the future of rural Minnesota. We're pleased to announce the following scholarship opportunities and invite all high school seniors to apply.

FRS College Scholarship Program

The FRS College Scholarship Program awards 30 scholarships in the amount of \$2,000 each to winning applicants across the nation, with a \$500 match by the sponsoring telco (for a total of \$2,500 each). By partnering with the FRS, West Central Telephone is able to make the scholarship program available to high school seniors in our area. Applications for the Foundation for Rural Service (FRS) Scholarship are due in the WCTA office by February 20, 2015.

Students may also be eligible for four FRS Staurulakis Family Scholarships valued at \$5,000 each or two TMS Scholarships for \$1,500 each. Students who are majoring in math, science, engineering, or medicine are given preference for the FRS Staurulakis Family Scholarships. Additional scholarships include the Everett Kneece Return to Rural America Scholarship, valued at \$2,500, and new for 2015 — the Colt Ford Scholarship, awarding up to \$15,000.

Minnesota Telecom Alliance Foundation Scholarships

The Minnesota Telecom Alliance Foundation is offering five \$2,000 scholarships to high school seniors who graduate in 2015. Scholarships are awarded after the student demonstrates successful completion of the first year of college or technical school. The application deadline is February 27, 2015, and applications must be returned to WCTA.

WCTA Scholarship Program

High school seniors can also apply for one of up to eight scholarships in the amount of \$1,000 each. The deadline for the WCTA Scholarship applications is April 6, 2015.

Our scholarship program has been established to encourage youth in our area to further their education after graduating from high school and is made possible through unclaimed capital credit checks. Because of our cooperative status, we are able to use these funds to benefit the scholarship program. At this time, there is over \$79,000 funding the scholarship program.

These scholarships are another example of a cooperative member-benefit, and as such, we would like to see all high school seniors apply. There are typically only 18 to 20 applicants each year. The scholarship is not income- or need-based, and although applicants should have at least a "C" GPA, they do not need to be at the top of the class. Students need to simply complete the online application, write a brief essay on the chosen topic, and submit by the deadline. The scholarship application can be found at wcta.net.
